**OFFICIAL GENERAL MUNICIPAL AND SPECIAL ELECTION BALLOT  
OF THE STATE OF GEORGIA  
NOVEMBER 7, 2017**

To vote, blacken the Oval (●) next to the candidate of your choice. To vote for a person whose name is not on the ballot, manually WRITE his or her name in the write-in section and blacken the Oval (●) next to the write-in section. If you desire to vote YES or NO for a PROPOSED QUESTION, blacken the corresponding Oval (●). Use only blue or black pen or pencil.

Do not vote for more candidates than the number allowed for each specific office. Do not cross out or erase. If you erase or make other marks on the ballot or tear the ballot, your vote may not count.

If you change your mind or make a mistake, you may return the ballot by writing "Spoiled" across the face of the ballot and return envelope. You may then mail the spoiled ballot back to your county board of registrars, and you will be issued another official absentee ballot. Alternatively, you may surrender the ballot to the poll manager of an early voting site within your county or the precinct to which you are assigned. You will then be permitted to vote a regular ballot.

**1% Transportation Sales and Use Tax**

(Vote for One)

Shall a special one percent sales and use tax be imposed in the special district of Haralson County for a period of time of twenty calendar quarters (5 years) and for the raising of an estimated amount of \$12,000,000, for the following purposes, pursuant to an Intergovernmental Contract, dated August 16, 2017 among Haralson County, Georgia, the City of Bremen, the City of Buchanan, the City of Tallapoosa, the City of Temple, and the City of Waco: (A) Allocation and funding the following outlay transportation projects for Haralson County (61.75%): (1) Renovation and Road Improvement (2) Renovation and Improvement of Bridges (3) Parking Improvements (Recreation)(4) Purchasing equipment for Road Maintenance (5) Excess Revenues for Renovation and Improvement of Roads (B) Allocation and funding the following outlay transportation projects for the City of Bremen (21.45%) : (1) Bridge and Drainage Projects (2) Pedestrian Sidewalks, Paths and Trails (3) Parking Improvements (4) Street Paving, Resurfacing, Traffic Control Devices and Related Projects (5) Excess Revenues for Renovation and Improvement of Roads (C) Allocation and funding the following outlay transportation projects for City of Buchanan (3.84%): (1) Renovations and Improvements to Roads (2) Addition to Sidewalks (3) Excess Revenues for Renovation and Improvement of Roads (D) Allocation and funding the following outlay transportation projects for City of Tallapoosa (11.01%): (1) Repaving and Improvements to Streets (2) Right of Way Maintenance Projects (3) Capital Purchase of Equipment for Right of Way Maintenance/Improvements (4) Excess Revenues for Renovation and Improvement of Roads (E) Allocation and funding the following outlay transportation projects for City of Temple (.16%): (1) Renovations and Improvements of Temple City Streets in Haralson county (2) Excess Revenues for Renovation and Improvement of Roads (F) Allocation and funding the following outlay transportation projects for City of Waco (1.79%): (1) Street Paving and Resurfacing Projects (2) Excess Revenues for Renovation and Improvement of Roads?
